



Reading with your children - KS2 Guide

At Deighton Gates we champion reading for its enjoyment and its impact on children's achievement. Research also continues to reaffirm the positive influence of reading *at home* and the impact this has on children's educational outcomes, when continued into the teenage years. Thus it is vital that reading at home with older children continues throughout KS2.



Parents can get involved with their child's reading through spending time reading and talking about books with them, encouraging them to read regularly, taking them to the library to choose books and by acting as reading role models.

In Key Stage 2 we run a Reading Passport and Reading Superstars scheme in each class, to help promote enjoyment and good attitudes to reading - copies of these can be found on the school website.
